### Want to teach SLS 1103 or SLS 0005?

#### **If you are a current FCCJ full-time or part-time faculty member:**

To be credentialed to teach SLS 1103 or SLS 0005, a faculty member must be credentialed to teach Credit courses within a specific discipline (18 graduate credit semester hours in a specific discipline from an accredited institution) and then complete an eight (8) hour SLS training.

SLS training is offered on a regular basis through the Florida Community College University (FCCU). The catalog of current FCCU offerings can be found at [www.fccj.edu/fccu](http://www.fccj.edu/fccu)

At this point, you can contact one of the SLS Hiring Agents to let them know that you are interested and available to teach SLS at his/her specific campus. See below.

#### **If you are a current FCCJ Administrator/Professional or Career Employee OR are not a current FCCJ employee:**

You will need to apply through the Adjunct Application Process – Visit the FCCJ webpage ([www.fccj.edu](http://www.fccj.edu)) and then click on Job Applicants in the left hand navigation bar. Then click on Search/Apply For Postings. On the Search for Postings webpage, select Adjunct Instructor (Part-Time Faculty)/Liberal Arts-Counseling on the Drop Down Menu for Job Title. Then Click Search. This will show you the job description for the Adjunct for Student Life Skills Course. You will need to log –in to complete the application. Unofficial graduate transcript is required for initial consideration of this adjunct position. If the hiring process progresses, you will need to submit official bachelor's and master's level transcripts.

To be credentialed to teach SLS 1103 or SLS 0005, a faculty member must be credentialed to teach College Credit courses at FCCJ within a specific discipline (18 graduate credit semester hours in a specific discipline from an accredited institution) and complete an eight (8) hour SLS training. For example, an applicant would need to have 18 graduate semester hours in business (within the credit hours earned as part of

a MBA), or perhaps the applicant has 18 graduate semester hours in sociology, in addition to a masters degree in education.

Once your application has been reviewed and it is determined that your postsecondary degrees and coursework qualifies you to teach, your name will be made available to the SLS Hiring Agents by Human Resources. The Project Renaissance office will inform Human Resources that you have participated in the SLS training.

At this point, you can contact one of the SLS Hiring Agents to let them know that you are interested and available to teach SLS at his/her specific campus.

## **SLS Hiring Agents**

The SLS Hiring Agents schedule college credit courses at their campus or center for SLS. They will make the determination if there is a need for a specific SLS course each semester, which session, time/day, delivery method, and which instructor they would like to hire.
