**More B.A.S. Degree Information:**

- The degree is designed for individuals who want to learn to be high quality leaders, managers, and administrators in the Public Safety fields of Criminal Justice.
- The program is offered to students for part-time or full-time attendance.
- The classes are offered on-line, face-to-face, and hybrid to meet student needs.
- A.S. Degree students in Criminal Justice Technology or Officer Administration fully matriculate into the degree. A.S. students must take additional general education classes not included in the A.S. degree and the 44 B.A.S. Public Safety Management courses.
- A.A. Degree students matriculate into the degree, but have to take up to 30 hours of lower division core criminal justice classes.
- Students must complete the CLAST or be exempt from it prior to enrolling in senior level B.A.S. classes.
- Students must have 2 years of the same Foreign Language in high school or complete 8 or 9 hours of the same language in college. Students may choose from Spanish, French, German, Sign Language, or any other language offered.
- Students should be aware that agencies hiring and offering internships may require background investigations that include driving, employment, military, drug, credit, child abuse, and criminal records. Poor records in any of these areas may harm student ability to gain internships, employment, or advancement in the Public Safety professions.
